GUIDELINES TO THE AUTHOR

BASIC INFORMATION

Cover letter: (only required if submission is made through mail to submitarticle@gjrmi.com, Authors submitting through online submission page need not necessarily submit a cover letter)

If the author prepares to send the Manuscript via mail (submitarticle@gjrmi.com) to GJMRI, then it should be along with a cover letter addressing the Editor-in-chief. The cover letter should specify the faculty in which the research has been done, along with the title of the topic. As a part of peer review, the Authors can also suggest the name and details of Referees with whom they would wish to get their Manuscripts Peer reviewed. But the final decision will be that of the Editor-in-chief to decide the Referees for Peer review.

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Mode of submission of Manuscript:

Format of the Manuscript: MS Word (No PDF submissions are accepted)

The Authors are requested to strictly submit the manuscripts from the online submission page in the Journal website (available at <http://www.gjrmi.com/ManuScript.aspx>) or send the articles through E-mail to submitarticle@gjrmi.com. Kindly note that GJRMI never accepts hard copies for review process. Also kindly avoid submitting fresh manuscripts to the mail id of the Editor, which will not be considered.

Peer Review Process

Type of Peer review

GJRMI is concerned more on Quality of articles hence prefers double blinded peer review in order to keep the reviews unbiased.

GRJMI is aimed at publishing High quality research while maintaining rigorous but sympathetic double blind peer review. Papers other than those with insufficient quality (on any grounds) will be peer reviewed by two or more experts in the field (Referees), and their reports will be sent to the editor. The editor will in turn discuss it with the Board members and convey the decision to the author through e-mail. Highest priority would be given to the articles with significant results after review.

The decisions of the Referees on the manuscript shall be anyone of the following, based on the quality of the article.

- If an article fits into all the criteria mentioned here on peer review, the decision will be **“to unconditionally accept the manuscript”**
- If an article has a few flaws with it which could be rectified, then the decision will be **“to accept it in the event that its authors improve it in certain ways”**, which will fall into either of the below 2 categories
 - Manuscripts with Minimal Revision
 - Manuscripts requiring Maximal revision
- If an article will be found to be sub-standard by all means then the decision will be **“to reject it, but encourage revision and invite resubmission”, or to reject it outright.**

Revision:

GJRMI insists the referees/technical editors to make use of the “Review” option in MS word to lay their comments on the manuscript by either using “Comment” option or to make “track changes” by additions or deletions of words, symbols, extra spaces etc. to ease the work of the authors during revision. The reviewed article will comprise of “Overall comments by the Referees” and comment boxes / track changes boxes within balloons on the right side of the reviewed version. Manuscripts requiring minimal revision will be given a maximum of 3 days + 2 days grace period to revise and resubmit according to the comments & manuscripts requiring maximal revision will be given a maximum of 5 days + 2 days grace period to revise and resubmit, failing which the article will be considered rejected (Note: The time given may be reduced, if the authors fail to correspond at the right time.)

Types of article to be published

Regular Research articles:

Should describe an original research work with new insights, novel approaches & specific confirmed findings. The length of a full paper should be the minimum required to describe and interpret the work clearly. (Maximum length: 15 pages in A4 size word file with single spacing in between the lines and margins 1” on the top and bottom & 0.75” on the right and left borders).

Short Communications:

Short communications could be made use in recording the results of complete small investigations or giving details of new models or hypotheses, innovative methods, techniques or apparatus. It should be confined to a maximum of three figures and one table. The study should be a complete one and the scope of the subject should be limited when compared to full length Manuscripts. The Abstract should not exceed 100 words; Materials & methods could be merged with experimental procedures with figures & footnotes; Results and Discussion shall be merged into a single section. (Maximum length: 5 pages in A4 size word file with single spacing in between the lines and margins 1” on the top and bottom & 0.75” on the right and left borders).

Review articles:

Reviews and perspectives covering topics of current interest are welcome and encouraged. (Maximum length: 6–10 pages in A4 size word file with single spacing in between the lines and margins 1” on the top and bottom & 0.75” on the right and left borders).

Note: Review articles will also be subjected for peer-review.

SPECIFICATIONS ON THE MANUSCRIPT PREPARATION

Preparing the Manuscript:

All portions of the manuscript must be typed in MS word

Page Layout – A4

Spacing – Single space in between lines. Use the option “Add space before and after Paragraphs” to give spaces in between 2 sections or paragraphs. Leave a single space after full stop, comma.

Numbering of pages should be done from the first page.

Margins - 1 inch on the top and at the bottom. 0.75 inch on the left and right side

Font to be used – Strictly Times new Roman

Size of Fonts – Title of the Manuscript – 14 (**BOLD UPPER CASE**)

Main headings ie. Abstract, Introduction, Methodology, etc. – 12 (**BOLD UPPER CASE**)

Sub Headings – 12 (**Bold lower case**)

Body of the main text – 12 (Normal case)

Using special features – Underlining words or phrases or sentences are strictly to be avoided, instead using **bold**, *Italics*, ***Bold Italics*** could be preferred.

Justification should be kept to full for the whole Manuscript.

Title:

The **Title** should start with the topic of the article center texted and in **BOLD UPPER CASE** using font number 14. Following which the Main Authors name is to be mentioned first with full name with Degree & Designation, followed by the name of the corresponding co-authors along with phone, fax and E-mail information. Present address of main author should appear as a footnote. Subtitles are not encouraged after the Main title of the article. In case of Medicinal plants research the botanical name of the species should appear in the Main title.

Abstract:

The **Abstract** should be a single Paragraph free from references & abbreviations, briefly present the topic, indicating the scope with significant data, and point out major findings and conclusions. The Abstract should be 100 to 200 words in length. Complete sentences, active verbs, and the third person should be used, and the abstract should be written in the past tense.

Abstract should be followed by about 3 to 10 **key words** that will provide indexing references should be mentioned.

Abbreviations:

Only recommended SI units should be used. Authors should use the solidus presentation (mg/ml). Standard abbreviations (such as HPTLC, DNA etc.) need not be defined. A list of non-standard **Abbreviations** should be added.

Brief Introduction:

The **Introduction** should provide pertinent background to the study, the relevant literature on the subject, and the proposed approach or solution. It should use a language understandable to researchers from a wide range of scientific disciplines.

Materials and methods:

Materials & Methods should elaborate the essential details along with the experimental design & statistical analysis. Use bold fonts for trade names and include the manufacturer's name and address. Subheadings should be used, while methods in general use need not be described in detail.

Results:

Results should be documented with precise findings. Manipulation of any data according to the authors wish, if found through any means will result in the rejection of the manuscript. Even when the study doesn't turn out to be positive as per Null Hypotheses, the same is to be published as such which will help readers & researchers not to put in new or advanced efforts on the same topic. Results should be written in Past tense & previously published findings should be written in the present tense. Results should be explained, without referring to the literature claims. The points of Discussions, speculations and interpretations should not be included in results and are to be placed in Discussion.

Discussion

The discussion should include the insights of the author and co-author during the whole study, interpreting the findings in view of the results on the research. Subheading can be used in both discussions and Results.

Note: only when appropriate, both results & Discussion sections can be combined

Conclusion

The conclusions derived from the study should be fixed at the end of this section which should be explained in few sentences.

Acknowledgements:

Persons other than Authors who had helped in providing technical support, drafting assistance, Finance, Material support and other higher authorities who had provided them a chance to conduct the work and others who have extended their hands to successful completion of the work should be acknowledged.

Tables:

Tables should be kept to a minimum and be designed to be as simple as possible. Tables are to be prepared using MS word only & numbered consecutively in Arabic numerals and supplied with a heading and a legend. The details of the methods used in the experiments should preferably be described in the legend instead of in the text. Utmost care is to be taken to make sure that the same content be not repeated in both table and graph form or repeated in the text.

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Figure legends should be typed in numerical order and shall be inserted at specific places within the word file wherever felt necessary. Graphics should be prepared using applications capable of generating high resolution GIF, TIFF, JPEG or PowerPoint before pasting in the Microsoft Word manuscript file. The file containing figures may be attached as a separate file along with Main Manuscript during submission. Use Arabic numerals to designate figures and upper case letters for their parts. Begin each legend with a title and include sufficient description so that the figure is understandable without reading the text of the manuscript. Care is to be taken not to repeat the matter in legends, again in texts.
